
TOTAL ENROLLMENT 2021-2024




STUDENT MEASURABLE SKILL GAINS 2021-24



TECHNOLOGICAL SYSTEMS – 7TH GRADE

VCWP Dashboard - Year-to-Date


All comparisons to PY23 baseline year
